LLW Repository's (LLWR) mission is to deliver a sustainable LLW service for the United Kingdom. We will apply this sustainable ethos to all that we do and strive to be an ethically responsible organisation with a positive impact for our communities. We will deliver this impact through: -

Our People:

- LLWR prides itself on being a safe and healthy place to work.
- We believe that company involvement doesn't stop at our site boundary.

How?

- LLWR facilitates full staff participation at all levels within the community, at present, staff on the site take on roles including:
 - Elected Representatives e.g. Parish/District/County councillors
 - JPs
 - School Governors
 - Mountain Rescue Teams
 - Reserve fire fighters

In support of these roles the LLWR terms and conditions of employment allow up to 18 days p.a. additional leave to fulfil these valuable roles. The contribution of our staff to the rescue and clean up operations during the 2009 Cumbrian floods has only strengthened our resolve to continue.

Our Supply Chain:

- We look to procure locally to support the Cumbrian economy and minimise the distances which materials for all areas of our operation must be transported to reach our site.
- LLWR seeks to become a key link in the sustainable procurement chain for our consignors throughout the UK nuclear industry.

How?

- On a large scale, we sought quarry products for Vault 9 within Cumbria and contracts were agreed with quarries at Millom and Frizington, supporting sustainable local employment and infrastructure.
- On a day-to-day basis, food and drink for 120 LLWR employees plus contractors is provided by businesses local to the site and offices at Holmrook.

Our Stakeholders:

- Fostering good links with our stakeholders in the West Cumbria community which hosts our operations is core to LLWR's philosophy.

How?

- Dialogue with our stakeholders is key to building and maintaining these relationships
- Alongside our site owner, the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority, we participate fully at senior management level in the West Cumbria Site Stakeholder group and its LLWR sub-committee.

Our Community:

- LLWR strives to be a responsible neighbour in terms of LLW and project operations on site.
- We aim to share our successes with our host communities.
- We believe strongly in developing opportunities and recognising achievements in West Cumbria

How?

- Consignors of LLW to the site are strongly encouraged to utilise container transport by rail to minimise disturbance arising from road movements through the surrounding area.
- LLWR originated projects also have a strong bias towards rail transport of raw materials, over 90% of construction materials for Vault 9 arrived via the onsite rail sidings.
- In conjunction with Drigg and Carleton Parish Council we fund the Drigg Bursary Scheme, providing financial support for vocational and university education for local young people.
- LLWR financially supports youth organisations, sports clubs, community awards and grassroots funds such as the Copeland Community Foundation.

- Alongside financial support, LLWR provides management expertise to the board level of local clubs and societies including Whitehaven RLFC.

Our Environment:

- We are working to reduce the impact of our operations on the environment.
- The LLWR site is also a haven for wildlife including numerous protected species of plants and animals

How?

- Even though LLWR is below the NDA estate carbon emissions reporting thresholds, we continue to monitor and record how much CO₂ and share best practice across other Site License Companies.
- We recognise the importance of preserving protected species and have undertaken work to enhance habitats on site.

Although a small site, we aim to make the biggest socio-economic impact we can on communities within a 15 mile radius (i.e. from Whitehaven to the North and Millom to the South) of our site and going forward LLWR Ltd resolves to work in the areas below and realise business benefits:

- Our People – LLWR will ensure employee engagement to further build on employee morale and enhance their ability to take on roles in the community beyond the gate. We will also invest in people as we feel it is our duty to develop the skills of the future workforce.
- Our Supply Chain – LLWR will support our suppliers to deliver good value materials in line with our CSR principles, supporting the both parties reputation.
- Our Stakeholders and Communities – LLWR will continue to engage with our local communities, our regulators and our customers to enhance our reputation and also build on our license to operate.
- Environment – LLWR will strive to work at a level over and above our regulatory requirements to deliver an enhanced reputation and reduce our costs from carbon emissions.
